1. **Original objectives:** Ambulance vehicle

2. **Has the objective been achieved?** Yes, See attached photographs in the following pages.

3. **Brief details of the organization:** Chautari Yuva Club has been established since 2004 in Myanglung Bazaar, Terathum district in Eastern Nepal.
This club has been established by all the youth of the Myanglung Bazaar. The main objectives of the club is to promote public awareness and social development through community education process. Emphasis on programs related to women empowerment. Conduct skill and income-oriented activities. Conduct various programs related to woman, child and handicapped. Promote the skill of Government and Non-Government agencies.
Actively participate on save the environment activities. Actively participate on social activities and development endeavor like road, forest, religious and cultural ceremonies, irrigation, toilets, public land, health education, sports, communication etc. Help and being helped by NGO and INGO in the true spirit of brotherhood.
Conduct economic activities for skill promotion and poverty reduction. Increase the health service utilization rate through social mobilization.

4. **Project Plan:** Providing an ambulance service in order to bring the patient located in the rural areas of the Terathum district to the BPKHIS (B.P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences). BPKHIS is the only major hospital located in Dharan in the closed to the aforementioned districts.




Ambulance donated by the Eifion Trust, U.K and operated by the Chautari Yuva Club with minimum cost as directed by the Red Cross Society. In certain circumstances Chaatari Yuva Club will exempt the service charge if the patient unable to bear it.

5. **Service started:** The ambulance was handed over to Chautari Yuva Club on June 6, 2016. The ambulance will be managed and operated by the Chautari Yuva Club. A clear operating procedure is in place that further ensures efficient and effective services to the villagers. On behalf of Efion Trust Mr. Bhagat Chongbang representing the primary contact person Krishna Limbu handed over the ambulance Chautari Yuva Club Chairman Mr. Udayraj Chongbang. Ambulance service available in the community broadcast in the Jaljale F.M station. On June 11, 2016 ambulance carried first patient from the Myanglung Bazaar to BHKHIS (Hospital located in Dharan, Sunsari).
6. **Beneficiary:** Ambulance service is mainly benefit the people in the rural areas of the Terathum and Dhankuta district. While permanent access to health care will be in the long-term goals for Terathum district people, ambulance will serve the urgent medical needs of the villagers, as well as those from surrounding communities. In addition, ambulance will also bring the patient to India across the border. Chautari Yuva Club started the ambulance service after a needs assessment of the community that put access to emergency care for the sick, disabled, the elderly, pregnant women, and children at the forefront. The nearest hospital is currently 5-6 hours away, and patients needing care are either carried, air lifted or transported considering urgency and resources.


7. **Community Impact:** The local communities were thankful to Eifion Trust for the ambulance and to the Chautari Yuva Club managing the service with minimum costs.
8. Timing of the vehicle arrived in Nepal was 2 months but due to some unavoidable circumstances like general election in Nepal delayed in importing the vehicle. In addition as the ambulance was imported with Nepal Govt. tax exemption and it took few months to get the approval from the Health Ministries, Social Welfare and Tax dept.


