- 1. Original objectives:** To replace existing roof as the roof is too old and leaking due to wear and tear. The school is struggling to keep all students under the roof and are vulnerable to extreme Monsoon rain and unbearable summer heat.
- 2. Has the objective been achieved?** Yes. The project was successfully completed. Local coordinator did an excellent job by leading the construction work and finishing the project on good time. [See attached photographs in the following pages.](#)
- 3. Where is the project site:** SHREE JETHI KANYA Primary School is situated in Syangja District in West Nepal. Located some 270 Kms west from capital Kathmandu.
- 4. Rotarians trip to Eladi:** Rotarians who handed over project at Shree Tribhuvan High School at Lamjung District, continued their journey to westwards to Pokhara. Having spent a night at Pokhara the Rotarians left for Shree Jethi Kanya Primary school at Eladi at 8AM on 17th

April. The road to Eladi was on North/South Highway for the first 38Kms followed by about 15 Kms of dirt seasonal track.

5. On arrival at village at 11am, the Rotarians were met by the school management committee and the teachers. The group were then ushered to the school premises which was situated on the top of a small hill. School children, locals and the rest of the school management committee were all waiting at school play ground for arrival of the Rotarians. The formal hand over of Eifion Trust funded facility took place immediately after welcome ceremony. The appropriately written Marble slab was unveiled to mark the formal hand over of facility to the school management. This was followed by several “Thank you” speeches by Chairman school management committee, the Head teacher and village administrator. Rtns in return thanked the locals for great welcome and asked them to look after the property well. The class room all look smart and secure from the adverse weather conditions.
6. **Beneficiary:** The primary beneficiaries is 75 young pupils from the age of 5 – 12, from the locality. The facility is also used during school holidays, for village gathering and the meetings when the weather is not in their favour. Shree Jethi Kanya school was established in 1983 and received Governments approval in 1989. All students come from farming community with very low daily income. Four ladies and 2 gents are employed as teachers
7. **Community Impact:** The local community as well as the pupils and staff in school are most grateful to Eifion Trust for kind donation they made, which made local’s dream come true.
8. The project was first of its kind from a private donor in the area. Prior to completion of this project the tin roof was worn out and young children gathered under the thatched roof temporary class rooms to study. The situation was against the good health and safety of the children and was vulnerable during the adverse weather conditions. Now with the new all weather roofs in place, the young children will study in safe class room environment. This will also give peace of mind to the Teachers, parents and the guardians.

11. Conclusion: The CGI roof replacement work, was very important project which, the local authorities were unable to complete, due to lack of fund. The fund received from Eifion Trust, for Shree Jethi Kanya was utilised sensibly. The school management committee, teachers, the parents and the guardians and the entire village is much grateful to the Eifion Trust for their kind gesture to this remote, poor village community.
